BOARD MEETING, November 15, 2010 NEWSLETTER MINUTES

Jim Legge, president, called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. Other board members present were Dan Hastings, second vice president; and Dorinda Meihls, treasurer. Also attending were Carol Gibson, on-site manager; Gina Cowan, assistant on-site manager; Kevin McQuade, maintenance superintendent; Melva Linville, property manager, and Suzanne Miles, human relations coordinator, for Linville Management Services, Inc.; and Dudley Leonard, cooperative attorney. Marsha Clark, first vice president, joined the meeting at 6:40 p.m. Six members signed in. Minutes of the October 18 meeting were approved unanimously.

Kevin gave the maintenance report. In October, 247 work orders were completed. There were three move-ins and three move-outs. Eleven rehabs are under way.

Palmer Lawn Professionals mowed four times; trimmed the perimeter fence once; completed application of granular fertilizer; finished trimming all bushes; and applied an herbicide to grassy areas. Termite treatments have been completed on Buildings #55 and 57. Classic Roofing has submitted a bid totalling \$68,158 to replace roofs on six buildings. This is less than the budgeted amount of \$88,000.

Concrete work is completed on sidewalks, driveways and steps. Asphalt grinding and paving have been completed. Striping is almost completed; painting of numbered and guest spots is 75 percent done. New playground equipment has been installed behind the clubhouse and on Stafford Place. The board voted unanimously to accept the Classic Roofing bids and Kevin's report.

Carol discussed the on-site manager's report. In October, there were 43 statements of credit, 54 statements of charges due, two attorney referrals, 31 defaults, seven exterminations and one vehicle violation.

Of the 14 two-bedroom units on the market, two have sold. Also available are one one-bedroom unit and one three-bedroom unit.

The board voted unanimously to accept Carol's report.

Jim opened the floor to member comments. Funding of the reserve accounts was discussed. Melva will report on the breakdown at the next meeting.

Jim thanked members for attending and the open session ended at 6:30 p.m.


