Minutes

The board approved the minutes of the May 17 board meeting.

Dog park survey

There were 43 responses favoring a dog park and 33 against a dog park.

Just a reminder that Highleah does not allow slip and slides due to the damage it causes to the grounds. Pools need to be emptied daily when not in use.






Message From your Board President
