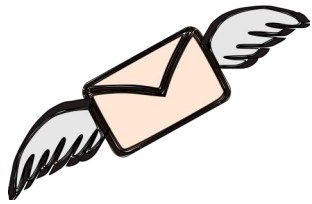

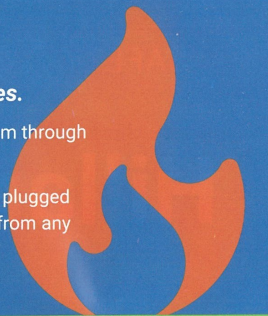

Prevent electric shock and fire.

Misusing common home appliances can potentially cause injury and electrical fires.

- Don't overload outlets or extension cords. Avoid stringing multiple cords together or running them through areas where they may get damaged.
- Never plug a portable space heater into a power strip or extension cord. Space heaters must be plugged directly into a wall outlet. And remember to always keep space heaters at least three feet away from any materials that could catch fire, such as bedding, curtains and rugs.
