Maintenance summary

In April, 169 service requests were received and 192 completed. There were two move-ins and two move-outs.

Eleven rehabs are in various stages of completion.

Fine Lines Lawn & Irrigation mowed four times.

New power lines were installed underground on Building 8 for a cost of \$10,945.43. Nine roofs have been replaced. Concrete replacement continues on Devonshire Place, Stafford Lane, Stafford Place and Buckingham Court. The cast iron main sewer line was replaced at 17888 Buckingham Court for a total cost of \$4,200.

Mike presented the managing agent report.

Seven applications were approved.

Processed in accounts payable for April was \$264,376.96.

Financial reports were delivered to the board.

Summer Water Usage

Children love water! When considering your water play purchases, keep Section 5.5 of your Rules & Regulations Handbook in mind. Note that plastic or inflatable wading pools should be no larger than 6 feet in diameter and 12 inches deep. Pools are not to be left unattended and must be emptied on a daily basis and stored in the back of your unit. No slip and slide type water activities are allowed. Help us control water usage this summer. It may seem free, but we pay for it through our carrying charges.


