


Revised Rules from the Board

Tab 1 Cooperative Member's Responsibilities

Section 1.1 Housekeeping Standards, A. 4. Windows should be clean and must not be nailed shut. All windows must always have acceptable window coverings when the unit is occupied. Acceptable coverings include blinds, shades, vertical blinds, curtains, or drapes. Shades or blinds should be intact. No sheets or blankets are allowed. "No reflective material or curtains are allowed on the back of window or patio door coverings or on the window or patio door. Doing so may damage the thermal barrier of the window and the member will be charged."

Section 1.2 Alterations/Installations, G. Window film cannot be applied to windows or patio doors. "No reflective material or curtains are allowed on the back of window or patio door coverings or on the window or patio door." 
